Dr. T. N. Srinivasan is a Ph.D. from and Samuel C. Park, Jr. Professor of Economics at Yale University. Formerly a Professor, and later Research Professor, at the Indian Statistical Institute, Delhi (1964-1977), his research interests include International Trade, Development, Agricultural Economics and Microeconomic Theory. He was a special adviser to the Development Research Center at the World Bank from 1977 to 1980, and has taught at numerous academic institutions over the past four decades, including MIT and Stanford University.

Dr. Srinivasan has authored a prolific collection of books and articles on econometrics, world trade, and developing country economics. He recently authored *Federalism and Economic Reform: International Perspectives*, with Jessica Seddon Wallack, Cambridge UP, 2006 as well as *Reintegrating India with the World Economy* with Suresh D. Tendulkar (Washington: Institute for International Economics, 2003) and edited the volume *Frontiers in Applied General Equilibrium Modeling: Essays in Honor of Herbert Scarf* (Cambridge University Press, 2005) with Timothy J. Kehoe and John Whalley and *Trade, Finance and Investment in South Asia* (New Delhi: Social Science Press, 2001). He is also the author of *Developing Countries and the Multilateral Trading System* (Boulder, CO: Westview Press, 1998).

Dr. Srinivasan is a Visiting Fellow at the Center for Research on Economic Development and Policy Reform, Stanford University and Fellow of the American Philosophical Society, the Econometric Society and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and a Foreign Associate of the National Academy of Sciences. He was named Distinguished Fellow of the American Economic Association in 2003 and was awarded the Padma Bhushan, the third highest civilian award of the Government of India.
